

Students will keep a journal of our discussion, film viewing and reading.

Make handmade fleece blankets or guilts for children that will be donated to local hospitals. Our mission is to provide love, a sense of security, warmth and comfort to children who are seriously ill or traumatized. Handmade gifts of love, created by blanketeers. The cost of class will cover materials for blankets to be made, given away, and one to keep for yourself.

Discerning Disney!

Grades: 7-12 January 5-9 Cost: \$25

We all have our favorite Disney movies, from Snow White to Toy Story to Tangled. Do you ever think about the powerful lessons in the movies or the worldview that is being portrayed in them? Movies can have a great impact on us, and we need to have discerning minds when it comes to our movie-watching. In this class, we will watch and discuss five Disney movies. Using our Bibles and thoughtprovoking questions, we will investigate some of the ideas/lessons/themes in the movies and seek to develop and strengthen our Christian worldview.

Grades: 7-12

Art Full of Expression

Students will learn application and instruction to make quality projects in art. Attention to detail and quality of work will be stressed. Art is a personal expression and everyone's talents will be explored.

One special week of exploring activities. See the creative and inspirational side of physical education. A world dedicated to motivating you mentally and physically. This week you will learn to live more spiritually through mind, body, and soul.

Famous American Businessmen

Grades: 7-12

This class will focus on the individuals from the 19th and 20th Centuries that transformed America into an economic superpower. The History Channel Series, *The Men Who Built America* will be watched and discussed. Students will be required to create a Powerpoint presentation on a current business titan.

Sports Authority

In addition, learn how to deal with angry people Biblically and how to deal with the challenges of making a bad call.

Film History and Analysis

We will be looking at basic elements of film composition, the history of film, and then spend significant time encountering challenging and important film.
